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The situation

- Capitalist mode of production is predominant in all countries.
- Labour reserves for capital has doubled and rose from 1.5 to 3 billion worldwide since the end of the cold war.
- The ratio between capital and labour has fallen and led to relative reduction of the price for labour and to a growth of capital profits.
- Readjustments of the capitalist world market after "opening" of China with its population of 1.3 bill.

What are Worlds of Labour? Labour:

- Creative or productive activities
- Acitivity to secure material reproduction of humane society

Worlds :

- geographic places/regions/countries
- historically grown cultural, social and economic entities

Grassroots & Cross border

- Grassroots approach will focus on (local) experiences and perspectives of selforganisation and empowerment, social movement and transformation
- Cross border global context approach repels national chauvinist ideas and agendas, while accepting and respecting different views

Objectives of the Forum

- bring closer the spatially separated worlds
- make socio-cultural commonalities and differences conscious and comprehensible
- uncover and demystify economic processes that cross geographic borders
- relate to each other the actual conditions of capitalist wage labour
- exchange steps to counter its repressive character and overcome it eventually

Social actors, target groups and methodology

- People in China and Germany who are involved in comparable worlds of labour i.e. of same TNCs, industries, production chain, sectors
- Social and labour activists within and outside of formal institutions
- Personal encounter and debate between those concerned and involved people and activists

Framework

- Continuous information and knowledge exchange and publication
- Encounters to exchange experiences and knowledge as well as for cooperation
- Research, analysis and theory building

- Continuous exchange of orginal documents, i.e. translating from Chinese to German and German to Chinese
- Documentation of conferences, workshops and visits
- Films/video on social issues with respective language subtitles
